LIBRARY NEWS

Your family is back into the fall routine – hockey, music lessons, harvest, ringette, football, homework, chores, lunches, etc. It's not easy to find time to read with your child, but this doesn't have to be extra time you find; reading can be integrated into all your daily activities. The Accelerated Reader (AR) program is underway, and at the time of this writing, students have

Remember that children need to read independently, be read to, and read with. So go share a book with your children!

SCHOOL REGISTRATION FORMS

If you have not already returned your students' registration forms for the this school year, please do so as soon as possible. It is

very important that we keep our records up-to-date with current permission forms as well as student personal information. These

forms were sent home with each student the first day of school.

SCHOOL FEES

We have sent home invoices for school fees for Grades 1–4 students and are very close to being able to do the same for Grades 5 –9. We would ask that you **do not** send payment or pay online for Grades 5-9 students until you receive the paper invoices or check online to see what the exact payments for options will be.

Select "Get Started Now" and follow the steps. After you receive the confirmation email, please select the 'click here' option, sign in and add each of your children to your household account. (Parents were emailed Student ID numbers so they were able to register. If you still don't have your student numbers, please call the school office.)

Once we are more familiar with the program, it is our goal to have field trips, fundraisers, etc. available for online payments.

Fee waivers: You qualify to have your school and transportation fees waived if you receive a GST rebate from the government. For more information, please call the office.

Please note that we still accept payments at the office for all fees.

We are off to a fantastic fall start in Grade 6! Students are understanding and following classroom routines and procedures. I'm very happy to report that students have filled the marble jar. Watch for your pose and color background choice flyer which will be sent home prior to photo day. Have your child return this flyer to the photographer on photo day. If the flyer is not returned your child will be photographed in a standard pose with a standard background.

The envelope your child will bring home from school approximately 10 days after photo day will contain your child's proofs and important order information.

Your completed photo order must be returned to the school your child attends by the "IMPORTANT ORDER DUE DATE" stamped in red on the order portion of the form.
