The Grade 3 classroom is coming alive, literally!

We have slowly acquired new animal (and plant) friends throughout this school year. Our year began with a fish named Lucky (who, as it turned out, wasn't so lucky after all...). Then we adopted a new fish: our beloved Flame. He is now very happy in his forever home at Marley's house. Our American Bullfrog tadpole is currently in the process of becoming a froglet and we have been able to actively witness the lifecycle changes! To top it all off, we received our new and final pets last Friday: the caterpillars. We quickly got to work in creating our Butterfly Caretaker groups and carefully filled our

terrariums with living and non-living things that we thought would be important to a butterfly's environment. All students did an excellent job of adding just the right ingredients!

All of our pets this year have helped us to become active and engaged learners. Students are excited to come to school each day and study changes that sometimes seem to occur overnight. We have become good at asking questions and seeking out answers. As we progress through the final portion of this year, we will continue to study these lifecycle changes and reflect on the changes within our own selves. There have been many. ## GRADE 2: SMALL, CRAWLING, AND FLYING ANIMALS

The Grade 2 students have been very excited about the animals in our classroom this past month! Students observed that there were builder, feeder, guard and nurse ants.

Students will continue to observe the Painted Lady Butterflies throughout the month of June, as well as Earthworms. They will also be completing individual research projects on a small, crawling or flying animal of their choice.

## FACTS ABOUT MATH

Developing basic literacy and numeracy skills is a primary focus from Kindergarten to Grade 4, and a continued focus through to Grade 12 in Rocky View Schools and across the province.
As with all programs of study, Alberta Education is responsible for developing the math curriculum, while teachers are responsible for its delivery. Alberta's math curriculum has a balance between constructing math concepts and number facts
and operations. By the end of As every child learns differently,

Grade 3, students are expected to a single approach to learning commit to memory addition and subtraction facts to 18 , and by Grade 5 multiplication and division facts up to $9 \times 9$. As students mature, they build on these math concepts by applying them to activities, solving problems, and later transferring them to real world tasks. This includes personal budgeting, constructing projects, and higher level applications such as statistics. would allow only some students to succeed. Rocky View teachers employ a variety of approaches to address the learning styles, cultural backgrounds, and developmental stages of each child. ## GRADE 1 NEWS

Grade 1 is gearing up for yearend and all the fun that includes! We are looking forward to our trip to many outside play and learning opportunities and to continuing to master more and more words in June and over the summer. In Language Arts, we continue with our Daily 5 model which includes Guided Reading groups with focuses on spring and spring animals. All Guided Reading groups are working on sequencing, organization skills as well as phonetics and vocabulary. Our current science unit is very exciting and is wrapped around spring weather and our in-class plants and caterpillars. We are practicing scientific observation, comparing two very different plant species, and

observing change over time as our caterpillars go from small insects to beautiful butterflies. In Social Studies, we are wrapping up our Community Scrapbook and will soon turn to our final unit - how we and our community change over time.

Our final Mathematics unit is 2-D and 3-D shapes in our world. This should wrap up well in time for some year-end review and a glance ahead to Grade 2 math.

## KINDERGARTEN NEWS: DUCKLING EGGS!

The Kindergarten has been vibrating with excitement since the arrival of our duckling eggs! Our anticipation heightened when we held the eggs up to our ears and heard for the first time the peeping and pecking originating from inside the shell. The first duckling hatched Monday, May 26 followed by our second duckling that hatched Wednesday evening after a long struggle to emerge from its shell. One duckling unfortunately did not survive the hatching process. The children have used their senses to observe the process while documenting, photographing and video recording our duckling's
development. Students will keep a journal tracking and measuring the growth of our ducklings. Soon we will get to view their exceptional swimming skills!
