#### **Funding Requests**

\$770 made by Monique Williams for insurance for Marsh's – Directors and Officers Liability Insurance.

\$1000 made by Mr. Tomlinson for bussing to and from Tyrrell Museum for Grades 4-5.

\$400 made by Mrs. Wood to cover the cost of speakers for presentations in April on Theme 5 Sexual Health Unit – Human Sexuality from the Heath Curriculum (approx. 66 students grade 7-9).

\$1000 made by Mrs. Ellefson for grades 6-9 to go to Banff National Park and White Museum as part of Canada 150 Design Cohort (estimated cost of \$100 x 30 students + transportation costs of \$700).

\$3,610.63 made by Mrs. Potter for Accelerated Reader Program (This is approximate cost based on US \$2700).

\$497 made by Mrs. Yanofsky – for Grade 2 in school field trip – (First Nations Dream and Small Crawling & Flying Animals).

\$250 made by Mrs. Graham for transportation to Grey Eagle Events Centre for grades 7-9 to see The Making of Treaty No. 7. Tickets will be paid for by the students. We get a deal of \$7 per ticket for a special show over lunch for students. (Tickets retail for \$100 each.)

\$1725 made by Mrs. Graham for Evergreen Theatre for K-6. (Total cost \$6,900 – our grant is 75% of this.)

\$1000 made by Mr. Wyper to fix the elevator outside – we must have RVS maintenance fix it for liability reasons. (This is an approximation as we do not yet have cost for siding and roofing.)

\$500 made by Mrs. Laughton for band students to go to concert performed by CPO Pixar (includes \$75 for bussing + subsidizing tickets for approx. 35 students - Tickets are \$40 less 10-20%.)

\$500 made by Mrs. Laughton for transportation for band festivals – RV Band Festival and possibly one more for grade 5-7 band students.

\$600 made by Mrs. Hart for students in room 1025 who require handi-bus for 2 trips – approximately \$300 per trip.

\$150 made by Mrs. Hart for grade 9 farewell (\$50 supplies+ \$100 photographer honorarium).

\$500 made by Mrs. Hart for Equine Assisted Learning program for 8 students (3 schools are involved so it brings our cost down) – Spring session only. A grant cannot be applied for as the organization is a for-profit organization.

\$500 made by Mrs. Broxham for 2 busses to Glenbow Museum for Grades 1-4.

\$1100 made by Miss Alard for bussing to/from COP for ski trip for grades 1-6 (approximate cost for 3 busses).

\$640 made by Mrs. Burris for field trip to Sandy Cross Conservation for grades 1-3 (\$250 bus + \$6 per student).

\$800 made by Mr. Winters for bussing for grades 7-9 to outdoor education in Kananaskis (approximately 30 students).

Voting on approval of funding requests to take place at the Indus School Council Society Meeting on September 26, 2016.

Monique Williams made a motion to have Crystal Sproule and Cindy Robinson added on as signing authority on the cheque request forms that go in to Andrea Hanson, and also that there must be two signatures on any requests made. Seconded by Andrea Desjardins. All in favor. Carried.

- Public Board meetings are on the 1 and 3 Thursday with other meetings of the Board generally planned for the other Thursdays.
- We are happy to announce that we have hired Greg Luderbauch as our new Superintendent. Greg comes to us from BC with a wealth of experience in all areas of running a school division.
- Trustees will each be taking Greg on a tour of their wards so that he can get a taste of what the division looks like and have a flavor of the strengths and challenges as well as the diversity in the division.
- Budget Passed June 2
  - RVS' 2016/17 budget aligns with Trustees' budget priorities: direct classroom instruction, inclusive education, specialized services for students with complex needs and balanced literacy, numeracy, and 21st C skills.
  - The budget was built with zero percent grant increases, except for IMR funding where RVS received \$1.9 million in additional revenues to help address the backlog of school building maintenance projects
  - RVS' budget totals \$250 million to address the needs of 21,499 students an increase of 817 FTE students over the previous year.
  - Of the total, 77.75 percent will be directed towards instruction, 13.04 percent to plant operations and maintenance (POM), 6.05 percent to transportation, 3.06 percent to governance and administration and 0.1 percent external services.

- Instructional budgets are projected to total \$194 million an increase of \$5.2 million over the previous year allowing RVS to hire 32 new teachers at the K-8 level and 13 new teachers at the high school level.
- Maintained 25 percent increase to inclusive education services and increased funding by \$600,000 to introduce a second multidisciplinary support team to support students with complex and emotional needs.
- Dedicated \$342,000 to replace staff lost through Regional Collaborative Service Delivery (RCSD) funding being re-directed to Alberta Health Services
- Added 3 FTE Literacy/Numeracy Learning Specialists and allocated \$241,000 for literacy resources and substitute support.
- Administration and governance costs are approximately \$7.7 million or 3.09 percent – a decrease from the previous year of 3.16 percent.
- The Carbon Tax Levy is anticipated to increase fuel and utility costs by \$231,000 in 2016/17 and by \$557,000 when fully implemented.
- ASBA SGM June 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>
  - Minister Eggen
    - 4000 students from Fort MacMurray are in various Alberta schools
    - School Act will remain for the 16/17 school year. Concerns remain on Ed
      Act
      - Need to ensure proper programming and classrooms to extend Ed to age 21
      - Need to work more closely on proposed student residency
      - Need to make sure act is properly aligned to close the act with our FNMI students
      - Need to ensure we're properly supporting the needs of our students
    - Doing extensive work to modernize and revamp the curriculum. They plan to be redoing 6 subjects within an 18 month time frame for each grade grouping instead of the usual 1 subject at a time. Whole process will take about 6 years. Will cover FNMI history (Truth and Reconciliation Commission), computer coding, mental health, and updated sex ed.
- Our Board passed the Instructional Fees for next year. I voted against the fees amounts.

Kindergarten - \$25/student Grades 1-8 - \$105/student Grades 9-12 - \$145/student

- We are working on the Ward Boundary Review and when we have some viable alternatives, the ideas will be presented to you so you can offer feedback. The boundaries need to be set prior to 6 months in advance of the 2017 elections.
- Provincial Education Issues Forum September 27 and 28
- Minister has said that there will be a 15-minute math facts section added to the Grade 6 PAT's. No calculators allowed.

  - o School Act has been given an extension for 2 years until Aug 2018
